Anthony L. Bolan (Tony) passed away at his home on October 18, 2020 at the age of 99.

He was born in Petaluma, CA to Louis and Catherine Bolan on May 3, 1921. He went to St. Vincent Catholic School, then to Petaluma High School. Tony graduated High School in 1939, and later graduated from Luther Burbank Business School and was employed by Bank of America that same year.

Tony is a US Army Veteran of World War II. He served at Guadalcanal and the Philippines. He was Honorably Discharged from service, Christmas Day 1945. He then returned to Bank of America and retired in 1981 after 40 years of service. Tony worked in many bank offices in and around the Bay Area. He enjoyed traveling, playing golf, and many other sports.

Anthony is preceded in death by his loving son Larry. A US Navy Veteran of Vietnam. Larry passed November, 2012. Also preceded in death by his loving wife Doris, in 1974, also brothers, Peter and Louis, sisters, Mary, Belle, Loni and Jeanne.
