



Gretchen Gloryetta Hamlett

November 8, 1934 - February 8, 2023

Gretchen Gloryetta Hamlett, born November 8, 1934, went home to be with the Lord on Wednesday February 8, 2023.

Born in Des Moines, Iowa to loving parents Robert A. Jackson, Sr. and Catherine Carr, Gretchen was raised in the loving home of her great uncle and aunt Henry and Julia Slaughter. Gretchen's primary education was provided in the Des Moines Public School system. She attended Nash Elementary School, Washington Irving Jr. High School, and in 1952 graduated from Des Moines Technical High School. Throughout her early years, Gretchen was actively involved in church, community and school activities involving sports, social committees, student council, service & pep clubs, and school newspaper co-editorial responsibilities.

In 1952 Gretchen married Carl Colie Jaco and from that union were born five children: Colie Jaco III, Carla Colice West, Pat Gloryetta Jaco, Carl Colie Jaco, IV and Winston William Jaco, Sr. Gretchen began what would be a 25-year career with Northwestern Bell Telephone Company – which later became US West and now Quest. In 1977 Gretchen married her late husband Zack Hamlett, Jr. and from that union her family became a blended family with the addition of Zack's five children: Zack Earl Hamlett III, Bruce G. Hamlett, Diane Cooper, Stephanie Stevenson, and Reginald

Hamlett. During this union Gretchen completed her Associate of Arts Degree from the Des Moines Area Community College, a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Grandview College and a Masters in Public Administration from Drake University.

During her career as a Marketing Sales and System Manager, Gretchen was a member of Blacks in Management, an organization that worked to empower and equip future leaders. After her retirement in 1986, Gretchen took a 2 ½ year appointment from Iowa Governor Terry Branstad, to serve as the Director of the Department of Human Rights. The Department contained 9 Advocacy Agencies which included: Community Action Agency, Commission on Children Youth and Families, Criminal Juvenile Justice Planning and Victim Assistance, Commission for the Blind, Deaf Services Commission, Persons with Disabilities Commission, Spanish Speaking Peoples Commission, Commission on the Status of Blacks and Commission on the Status of Women. She spent her evenings teaching courses in marketing at Des Moines Area Community College. In 1989 - 1997 Gretchen and Zack became “snowbirds” before they permanently relocated to Arizona.

Gretchen considered herself to be a Christ-centered woman led by God. As a longtime member of Corinthian Baptist Church in Des Moines, Gretchen served as Church School Teacher, Choir soloist, and member of the Corinthian Baptist Trustee board. Gretchen also served as a Women’s Day speaker at a host of churches including Corinthian, Maple Street, Wesley United Methodist, and Shiloh Baptist. She served her community through the Daughters of Des Moines, a civic and social nonprofit, where she took on various roles, including president, secretary, and treasurer. After relocating to Arizona, Gretchen joined the First Institutional Baptist Church of

Phoenix Arizona. There she served as a teacher for the Children's Church School for 20+ years. In 1993 - 1994, under the leadership of Rev. Leon Howard Sullivan's International Foundation for Education and Self-Help (IFESH) program, Gretchen and Zack spent 10 ½ months in the Gambia, West Africa as Teachers for Africa.

As a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. for nearly five decades she served in a host of roles to empower youth, increase voter turnout, and champion civic engagement. Gretchen's lifetime goal was to utilize her experiences, knowledge, skills and abilities to mentor and train African American youth and adults, teaching techniques for succeeding in American society. She established "Aid A Kid" Summer Pre-school Learning Program in city parks in African American neighborhoods. In Phoenix she gave Black History Dramatic presentations at Phoenix Gateway Community College, Mesa Community College, and the Sisters of the Valley. Outside of her roles as a mentor and active church member, she enjoyed activities such as dominos, playing cards, storytelling, baking peach cobbler, and bowling.

Gretchen fought the good fight, holding fast to her faith in Jesus. She continued to serve others through her activism and community organizing at Emmanuel Baptist Church and in sisterhood with her beloved San Jose Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.

Gretchen was preceded in death by her husband Zack Earl Hamlett, Jr., two children, her infant son Colie Jaco III and daughter Carla Colice Jaco-West, her father Robert A. Jackson, Sr. and mother Catherine Carr Curtis, a sister Ellen M. Edwards, two brothers

Robert A. Jackson, Jr. and Floyd Jackson McGee and a grandson Winston William Jaco Jr. She is survived by her daughter Pat Gloryetta Jaco; her sons Carl Colie Jaco, IV (Ivy) and Winston William Jaco Sr. (Kerry); three sisters Roxanna Mayes, Rosalind Miller, and Myrtle Curtis; six grandchildren, Shelly Quintana, Willie Earl West, Nateka West, Dianne Jaco, Dana Jaco and, Taunya Jaco, as well as a host of great grandchildren, nieces, nephews and extended family and friends.
